

## What is an Airport All-Beverages License?

An Airport All-Beverages License is for use at publicly owned airports served by scheduled airlines, and enplaning and deplaning a minimum of 5,000 passengers annually. This license has many of the same privileges as All-Beverages Licenses.

### Airport All-Beverages License MAY:

- Lease the license to up to three individuals or entities approved by the department
- Use the airport terminal, or a portion of it, as the licensed premises for on-site consumption of alcoholic beverages, regardless of other businesses or activities operating within the terminal
- Sell packaged alcohol to go in original packaging
- Apply for a noncontiguous storage area
- Apply for a catering endorsement
- Apply for a delivery endorsement to deliver beer and wine in original packaging if the delivery includes food and is prepared by the licensee at the licensee's premises
  - The purchase price of the delivered beer and wine may not exceed the purchase price of the delivered food

### Airport All-Beverages License MUST:

Be able to demonstrate that there are adequate safeguards in place to prevent public access to alcoholic beverages after hours, either by the presence of a lockable door or other security features such as rolling gates, locking cabinets, tap locks, or key card access.

### Airport All-Beverages License MAY NOT:

- Concession
- Provide curbside pickup
- Serve alcoholic beverages outside the terminal area where passengers enplane and deplane (e.g., hangar)
